

## ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

November 4, 2025

### FINANCIAL REPORT

- **SPLOST AND LOST.** SPLOST and LOST revenue shown in the report dated September 30, 2025 reflect collections made in September and remitted to Gordon County in October of 2025. For that period, SPLOST collections were \$1,284,734.76 which is a \$4,930.11 (.38%) decrease over the same period last year. LOST collections were \$789,932.57 which is a \$3,929.75 (.5%) decrease over the same period last year.
- **ELECTION NIGHT.** Polls close at 7 p.m. tonight and soon thereafter we will know if the three tax relief measures on the ballot have passed.

### SIGNIFICANT PROJECTS AND ACTIVITY

- **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.** An industrial manufacturing company EAE has leased the entire warehouse across Hwy 41 from CFL and is repurposing it for manufacturing. Project designs are pending on Dodd Ave (over 2 million sq ft.) and Hwy 41 at McDaniel Station (1.6 million square feet) as well as a project off of LX drive and another at Spring Hill and Trimble Hollow.
- **BIRD FLU.** The Georgia Department of Agriculture reported bird flu infected a commercial flock in Gordon County. This matter fell under State jurisdiction and Gordon County offered assistance as needed. The State depopulated the flock and has been monitoring the area to confirm there is no additional threat.
- **RETIREMENTS.** We celebrated Connie Bohannon's retirement from the D.A's office after many years of service. Also, Jim Bradford has announced that he will be retiring as head of Code Enforcement on January 2, 2026.
